What you'll be doing

Helping children

- Contribute to the learning experiences of children through the Little Pioneers Way considering the interactions that take place during the day.
- Work seamlessly together, providing families with an exceptional experience. Promote partnerships with your key children's families to drive the best outcomes for their children and be there for your families every step of the way.
- You will swiftly address any child protection concerns and ensure they are acted upon immediately and appropriately through early identification, reporting to the designated safeguarding officer and always asking if unsure.

- You'll be big on safety ensuring you keep yourself updated on training and keep yourself up to date with all policies and procedures ensuring compliance is always achieved in your room.
